

Hereford Rural North Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT)

PC Cullen and PCSO Ekanite will be taking the Police mobile station to Breinton Springs Car Park 10-2pm and Sutton St Nicholas School 2pm -4pm on 15th July 2016.

How safe is your home from Burglars? Do you own things of sentimental value, which would be impossible to replace? Or things which could be replaced but at a cost? Dormington

Police have seen a recent increase of reports across Herefordshire from residents who have been offered items for sale. Items include chainsaws and generators, often being sold well above the recommended retail price or of poor quality. Anyone who has been approached with these or similar items should avoid purchasing as it could negate your consumer rights if faulty or you're unhappy with the item.
